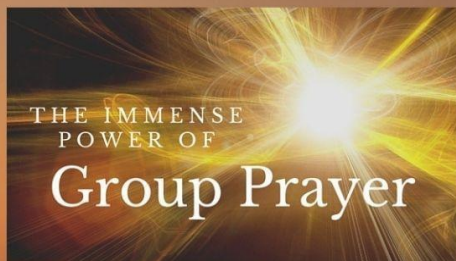

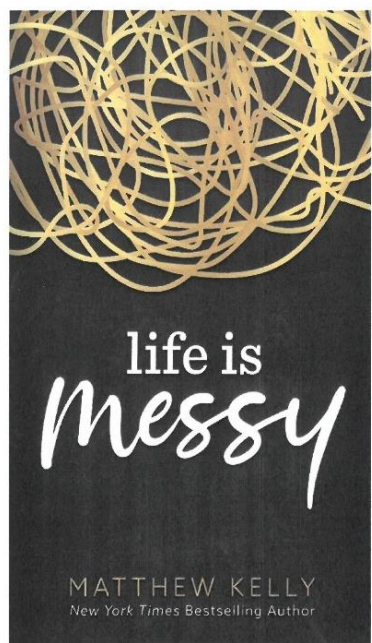

be a great way to ready yourselves for the coming of the Lord. Besides the mass the Holy Hour is one of the most powerful prayer services there is.

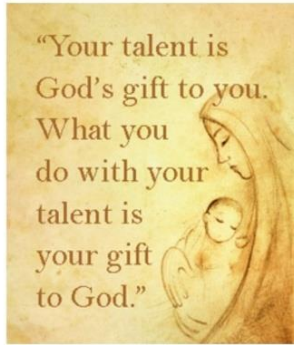

Finance – No report was given because Finance Council moved their meeting to March 24, 2022.

Liturgy and Music – No report was given.

K of C – No report was given.

Altar Rosary Society – ARS met in February. The February bake sale earned \$1,040.

CCD – No report was given

RCIA – One person is participating

Old Business:

Russ Pierce reported the water loss at the CCD house should be taken care of.

The restroom renovation plans were sent to the Building Commission at the Diocese. Father Dan is waiting for some required revisions/additions by the architect. Then this will need approval by the Diocese and State of Ohio.

Russ plans to go forward with the sidewalk repairs, and curb placement to close the alley

CRHP 2.0 / Welcome: continues to be on hold.

FORMED – Diane Collins is facilitating a book discussion group on *Life is Messy* on Wednesday evenings.

Super Bowl/Valentine Meal - Income: \$1,675 Cost: \$1,272.13 Profit: \$402.87 There was a lot of leftover meat. Some was used for the March Community Meal, and there is plenty left for other needs.

New Business:

Parish Mission/Vision - Andrew Reinhart returned to continue to guide the group in creating parish sacred purpose.

Diocese - The Living Christ Endowment and Capital Campaign has begun with a successful pilot campaign involving six parishes. Saint Michael will be in the first wave of 24 parishes to begin soon. Preparation work has already begun.

Blinds for gym: Dale Gallup consulted Lisa Laker for assistance in picking out roller blinds for the gym. The discounted cost for ten windows will be approximately \$2,100.

For the Good of the Cause:

Parish Directory – The 1st draft was received in Jan. 21. The draft was reviewed. Many errors were found. On February 4 the revised edition was sent back. Now we are waiting on the company.
