

OF THE UNITED STATES--There are pamphlets on the table across from the elevator upstairs that give information about the Templars, who were recently at our Parish. Whether you're just curious or interested in more information, pick one up. This pamphlet gives great information, history, and current information, including a link to the AUTHENTIC website that gives even more info. Were you curious about their clothing? For the Men: The white mantel cloak of the ancient Knights of the Temple with the frieze of a red embroidered patent cross on the left shoulder is the one granted in the year 1128 by the Supreme Pontiff Honorius II to the first Knights Templar Grand Ma ster, Hugo de Paganis. Following internal hierarchic level of chivalry, the cloak is worn over a white coat with a red patent cross on the chest and at the waist a leather belt. For the Women: A black cloak with hood and a red embroidered lozenge on the left shoulder, worn with a white scarf knotted at the neck.

This week's Ministry Spotlight ~

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - RCIA is a way for non-Catholics to learn about our Faith. The process begins with Inquiry, what we call the "Why Do Catholics Do That? Class", which can begin solely by contacting Father Borgelt or a member of the Team. Attending the Inquiry classes is not a commitment to join the Church: it begins only as inquiry and is completed when the individual desires. Those that choose to go on toward joining the Church, then take the Catechumen Classes. Most are accepted into the Church at the Easter Vigil and are formally welcomed in the Catholic Community by the Bishop with a Mass at the Cathedral in Toledo in April or May. Anyone, already Catholic, is welcome to attend as a way to review the Catholic Faith and learn more. This team can also prepare Catholics who did not receive all of their Sacraments to get ready for Adult Confirmation, scheduled at the Cathedral in Toledo with the Bishop each May. 



Do Not Conform Yourself to this Age

St Paul tells us, "Do not conform yourself to this age but ...discern...what is good and pleasing..."

Since Roe v. Wade, around 63 million innocent children have lost their God-given right to live. An entire class of persons, children in the womb, have been relegated to the status of "chattel", personal property, who can be disposed of by those more powerful than they. They have no power to resist. They are subject to abuse and destruction by those with more power, namely the power of the State. They have no voice that can be heard except our own.

Without doubt, the killing of innocent children in the womb is the pre-eminent moral evil of our age. It is for this reason that we must "not conform" to this grave injustice. As St Paul tells us, we must instead stand on the side of truth and justice and "what is good and pleasing to God". We must recognize what both medical science and natural justice tell us: children in the womb are human persons with an inalienable right to life.

Undoubtedly, the most important human rights issue of our age is to protect our "first neighbors" ----children in the womb. The womb is the "first home" of the whole human race and standing up for them is a matter of solidarity with our neighbor and love for the poor. We should not stand by while thousands of children every day are evicted and killed!

Our call (as St Paul reminds us) is to replace the current culture of death with a new culture of life and a civilization of love.

Statement from Bishop Thomas

Statement of Bishop Daniel E. Thomas Regarding **Issue #1 Being Placed on the November Ballot**

The inclusion of Issue #1 for a vote on the November ballot should alarm us all because of its profound disregard for human life, for the health and safety of women, and for the rights of parents. Make no mistake this amendment would not only enshrine abortion into the Ohio Constitution but take it to its furthest extreme by placing women at risk in an unregulated abortion environment, undermining the right of parents to know if their young children are having abortions or medical treatments contrary to their beliefs, and permitting late-term abortions, even up to birth.

This horrific amendment should compel all of us to reject it on the grounds of its complete disrespect for human life, its disrespect for the women of Ohio, its disrespect for parents and their rights, and its disrespect for a baby about to be born. I hope, pray, and encourage all people to VOTE NO on Issue #1 in November.
