

For the Women: A black cloak with hood and a red embroidered lozenge on the left shoulder. worn with a white scarf knotted at the neck.

In the wake of the unexpected violence in the Holy Land, please join us as we pray for Israel.



40 HOURS EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION

Mark your calendars for October 20, 21 & 22. St. Mary Parish Christian Formation Committee and the Amazing Parish Leadership Team have worked together to organize three days of Eucharistic Devotion. There are special days of adoration and prayer before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. (see schedule below) We will have the regular weekend Masses, Saturday at 4:00 pm, and Sunday at 8:30 am. The time of Devotion will end with a Solemn Closing and Benediction on Sunday at 4:00 pm. Fr. Dave Cirata will give the homily. A Parish Meal will follow at the conclusion of the Benediction Service.



Pope John Paul II expressed the importance of the Eucharist in Ecclesia de Eucharistia (2003) by saying:

The worship of the Eucharist outside of Mass is of inestimable value for the life of the Church.

It is pleasant to spend time with Him, to lie close to His breast like the Beloved Disciple (cf. Jn 13:25) and to feel the infinite love present in His heart. If in our time Christians must be distinguished above all by the "art of prayer," how can we not feel a renewed need to spend time in spiritual conversation, in silent adoration, in heartfelt love before Christ present in the Most Holy Sacrament?

These words are well suited to the current efforts of the Church for a National Eucharistic Revival. The 40 Hours Devotion is a practice established years ago to remember the forty hours that Jesus spent in the tomb, from the time he was taken down from the cross until his resurrection on Easter morning.

Election of Officers – Jim Siler moved for the slate of officers to be as follows: Chairperson Cody Sanders; Vice Chairperson Greg Balser; and Secretary Diane Collins. Janet Langham seconded. All voted yes.

<u>Minutes from the Last Meeting</u> – The May 11, 2023 minutes were approved as written.

 $\underline{Finance}$ – A basic Summary of Income and Expenses was shared. There was a discussion about the sale of folding chairs in the basement. There is interest in the chairs outside the church community. It was asked if we might want to consider renting out the chairs that do not sell. Storage space is a problem.

Liturgy and Music – Christmas and New Years masses are scheduled.

 $\underline{\mathbf{K} \text{ of } \mathbf{C}}$ – The guys are working on the upcoming Block Party.

<u>Altar Rosary Society</u> – Helping with potato preparation for the Block Party.

 \underline{CCD} – CCD has started. It was suggested we recognize the teachers. The council would like to know if there is a CCD fund that can be used to give the teachers some money to use for their classrooms. We were told that some teachers are using their own money.

<u>**RCIA**</u> – There is nothing new to report. Classes are ongoing. Anyone interested in attending these classes! Anyone interested in helping as a member of the RCIA Team?

Old Business:

• Maintenance Item:

John Paul II Room – Ceiling tile and carpet needs attention. The project has been approved. Parking Lot Sealing and re-striping – Russ Pierce took care of the project. A/C Unit – Needs repaired. Drainage around CCD building – Brian Amstutz will do the work.

Restroom Renovation – Diocesan Building Commission – review and further details

needed. John Police is working on these. Still waiting on John Police / architect for blue

prints. Father spoke with Russell Pierce to contact architect in May, 2023.

A faucet in the basement women's restroom sprays water when turned on. Theresa asked if she could have her husband repair it. Cody moved to have Dave Battershell called to repair it. Judy seconded. All voted yes.

- Church PA system The system was installed July 31 August 4, 2023.
