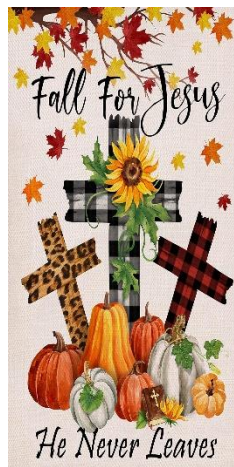

This week's Ministry Spotlight ~

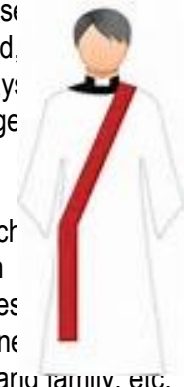
Diaconate – A deacon is a man who is ordained for the Diocese to inspire, promote and help coordinate the service (or Diakonia) that the whole Church must undertake in imitation of its model, Christ. He has the special responsibility to identify to the Church those who are without power or voice at the margins of society.

--**The Ministry of Charity/Justice**, in which he is called both to assist those with immediate needs, (clothes, food, shelter, etc) and also to develop ways to empower people to address the large social issues (Discrimination; right to Life; Equality, etc.)

--**The Ministry of the Word**, in which proclaims the GOOD NEWS both in word and deed, in preaching homilies as well as teaching, counseling, witness in marriage, and family, etc.

--**The Ministry of Liturgy**, in which he assists at the altar of worship, Eucharistic Assembly, serves as the means of bringing the needs of the community to be raised up in prayer. Liturgy is also the means for the deacons drawing strength and inspiration for living in the community as a diaconal witness.

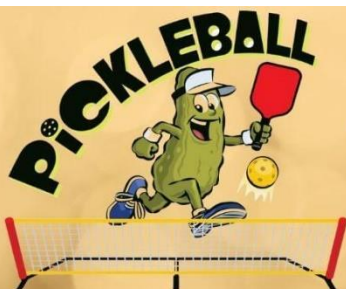
Boys and Girls who attend St. Michael Parish,

For the Men: The white mantel cloak of the ancient Knights of the Temple with the frieze of a red embroidered patent cross on the left shoulder is the one granted in the year 1128 by the Supreme Pontiff Honorius II to the first Knights Templar Grand Master, Hugo de Paganis. Following internal hierarchic level of chivalry, the cloak is worn over a white coat with a red patent cross on the chest and at the waist a leather belt. For the Women: A black cloak with hood & a red embroidered lozenge on the left shoulder, worn with a white scarf knotted at the neck.


