

The duties would include shoveling the sidewalks, and laying salt down when needed. This would be only when there is 2"or less of snowfall.


The volunteers would have to be available for any church events. Masses, CCD, meetings, funerals, etc, that occur during a slight snowfall.



Following internal hierarchic level of chivalry, the cloak is worn over a white coat with a red patent cross on the chest and at the waist a leather belt. For the Women: A black cloak with hood and a red embroidered lozenge on the left shoulder, worn with a white scarf knotted at the neck.

Dear Parishioners,






