If you would like to write a note of encouragement or share your experience of your First Communion or Confirmation, we will have baskets at the entrances for you to drop your


for you to drop your sealed envelope marked with the student's name. We are hoping that these create more community here at St. Michael.

There are many ways, for all ages, that you can help visit those in Prison. Here are some ways!

- Baking Forgiveness Cookies. There are instructions in a gallon baggie on the Kairos table at St. Michael and St. Mary. You can hand all cookies in anytime before 10:00 am March 14. Please Pray for the Kairos inmates while baking.
- 2. Color Placemats. There are directions and placemats on the Kairos table, take as many as you like. Hand in before March 14. This is a great activity for CCD classes, just hand them into there Instructor and they can put them on the Kairos table please.
- 3. Green Agape! Gods loving money to help pay for food and material for 24 inmates and 30 Kairos Outside Team Members. St. Mary, St Joseph, and St Michael have been extremely generous. Just drop \$ Money or check made Payable to Kairos of Ohio into the cash box on the Kairos Table, before March 21Prayer Vigil. There are tax forms if needed.

Jesus Christ, Son of God, Not Only With Us But Also Within Us

Mass and Four Reflections

Thursday: How can we even try to understand the next life while still in this life?




We often assume parenthood happens easily after "I do," but for many married couples, it does not. For some, the joy of conception never happens. Others suffer repeated miscarriages. Still others experience secondary infertility: after giving birth to one or more children, they are unable to have another.

The pain can become overwhelming. Social media posts of pregnancies, baby announcements, or pictures of newborns may intensify feelings of being alone in the ache for a child. Attending baby showers and being around children or pregnant women can be excruciating.

If you experience difficulty bringing a child into your family, know that you are not alone. God is with you, and his Church desires to walk with you. The following suggestions may be helpful to you on this journey.

Start with Prayer, Connect with Others, Seek to Understand the Church's Teaching, Learn the Difference between Ethical and Unethical Interventions, Be Aware of "Treatments" That Destroy Life, Make a Plan, Keep Your Marriage Healthy. Hold fast to the constant truth of God's love for you. "To couples who cannot have children of their own," St. John Paul II affirmed, "you are no less loved by God; your love for each other is complete and fruitful when it is open to others"[7] and their needs. In times of suffering, Pope Francis notes, "we sense a powerful need for someone to be close and feel compassion for us." You are not alone: "Jesus 'does not abandon those whom he loves." [viii]

Even if we ourselves do not experience difficulty bearing children, we can be channels of God's mercy for those who do.
