

<u>Minutes from the Last Meeting</u> – The January 11, 2024, minutes were approved as written.

<u>Finance</u> – A financial report was shared.

<u>Liturgy and Music</u> – The group met to prepare for Lent and Easter.

<u>K of C</u> – There is one fish fry left.

<u>Altar Rosary Society</u> – The group recently went to see a movie on Saint Cabrini and have dinner out in lieu of a regular meeting. The annual Easter bake sale is being planned.

<u>CCD</u> – The children participated in the Ash Wednesday Mass. The Leadership Team has recognized the First Communion and Confirmation students with prayer rocks and photos.

 $\underline{\mathbf{RCIA}}$ – There is one candidate to join the Church.

Old Business:

- Maintenance Items Nothing has been done toward updating the ceiling tile and floor in the JP II Room. Drainage work around the CCD house still needs completed. It was noted that some of the baseboard needs replaced in the CCD house.
- Strategic Plan There are a couple new banners up stating our sacred purpose. Father needs to do a write-up and talk regarding the plan. We plan to review the Strategic Plan at the next meeting.
- Restroom Renovation The Diocese returned the restroom plans as they say there are still things that need clarified. Father sent the blueprints back to architect John Police.
- FORMED -is an on-line faith formation resource. Recently a video series was done.
- Church PA system Father is looking for volunteers to help with sound tech and livestreaming.
- Diocese Living Christ: Endowment and Capital Campaign still at work.
- Recruiting and Training people for church ministries. It was suggested we update the ministry descriptions.
- Sacred Purpose Banner Two are mounted. One is above the elevator, and one is mounted in the gym.
- Parish website Cody shared quotes he gathered from two different companies. 4LPI.com and ecatholic.com offer web site design services. It was suggested that we look at them and have Jan look at each site to see what she thought. Cody will follow up.
- The square dance held February 24 was briefly discussed.

New Business:

- In March Bruce Guilford and Dale Gallup met with someone about putting a PA system in the basement and gym. Nothing was reported.
- It was decided to purchase one or two AEDs' (automated external defibrillators, to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest.) The Finance Council approved the cost of \$2,700 each.
