





Minutes – St. Michael Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council met on Thursday, May 9, 2024, at 7 p.m.

The meeting was opened with prayer.

Present were: Father Dan Borgelt, Co-chairpersons Cody Sanders and Greg Balser, Secretary Diane Collins, Judy McCalla, Theresa Calvin, Christine Wonderly and Jim Siler. Bob Crites and Janet Langham were absent.

<u>Minutes from the Last Meeting</u> – The March 14, 2024, minutes were approved as written.

Finance – A financial report was shared.

<u>Liturgy and Music</u> – The Senior Mass is being worked on.

K of **C** – Mother's Day breakfast is coming up.

<u>Altar Rosary Society</u> – A breakfast for the seniors & a meal celebrating the anniversary of Father Dan's ordination is being planned.

<u>CCD</u> – First Communion and Confirmation celebrations went well. Cody asked if First Communion families could have a celebration together in the church gym following mass instead of each family celebrating separately.

RCIA – One candidate joined the church.

Old Business:

- Maintenance Items The ceiling tile and floor in the JP II Room has been updated. Father spoke to Brian Amstutz who will speak to Russ and Bob about the drainage work around the CCD house. Cody moved to put two loads of Duraberm down in the alley Judy seconded. All voted yes.
 - Father is going to talk to Brian about doing his work before the alley is repaired.
- Strategic Plan There was nothing new.
- Restroom Renovation Russ spoke to the architect. Russ worked through some of the info requested by the Diocese.
 Father should have the revised blueprints to submit to the Diocese soon. Once the plans are approved, then he can move forward with getting contractor estimates.
- FORMED on-line Faith Formation resource.
- Church PA system There are still some glitches to be worked out. A rep from All Pro will be coming to meet with liturgy people and others who use the system. Father is looking for volunteers to help with sound tech and livestreaming.
- Diocese Living Christ: Endowment and Capital Campaign still at work.
- Recruiting and Training people for church ministries is ongoing.
- Sacred Purpose Banner Two are mounted. One is above the elevator, and one is mounted in the gym. Placemats were made to use at funerals and other church functions.
- Parish website Cody requested and received comments from the staff regarding our current website.
- It was decided to purchase at least one **AED** (automated external defibrillator), to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. The cost is \$2,700 each. There are differing opinions about whether we should get one or two. *Note Fr. Reviewed the estimate and \$2,700 is for two AEDs*.

New Business:

- In March Bruce Guilford and Dale Gallup met with someone from All-Pro about putting a PA system in the basement and gym. Sound board was suggested as part of the project. The estimated cost came back at \$29,000. It was decided to wait until after the restroom project was completed. Bruce will also get a second opinion.
- Russ spoke to an electrician about the electrical panel by the church doors. The panels stopped working and the breakers are being used to turn the lights on and off. The estimated cost to replace the control panel is \$21,000. It was suggested that we will wait until the restrooms are completed. An air conditioning unit needs replaced.
- Father is looking for ideas for summer and fall activities. A Tin Caps game was suggested along with a group bus trip to Rome City. Our church is participating in the Summer Sack Lunch program on Mondays. The food stand will be used again.
- There was a discussion about using our church as a storm shelter. It is listed as a storm shelter with the village but there seems to be a lack of communication and timeliness in getting the church open for such a need.

For the Good of the Cause:

- It is time for nominations and selection of new pastoral council members.
- The National Eucharistic Congress is going to be July 17 21, 2024 in Indianapolis.

The closed with a prayer.

The next meeting will be Thursday, July 25, 2024 with a potluck at 6 p.m. This is for current members of Pastoral Council and Finance Council, and the newly elected council members will be invited.
